

Odom's Late Inning heroics push Chiefs past ASH 6-4

NATCHITOCHES, La. - Andrew Odom smacked a two-run double to center to break a 4-4 tie in the bottom of the sixth inning as the Natchitoches Central Chiefs defeated the ASH Trojans, 6-4, Tuesday afternoon at PARC Natchitoches in non-district baseball competition.

The Chiefs (3-0) fell behind 4-0 as the Trojans (2-3) scored four runs on five hits in the second inning to take the early lead.

NCHS fought back with three runs in the fifth as Adam Guillet hit an RBI single scoring Yancy Spillman. Odom, who reached on a single, would score on a pass ball to cut the lead to 4-2 Trojans. Guillet would help trim the lead as he too scored on a pass ball making it 4-3.

The Chiefs tied the game in the sixth inning as Spillman drilled an RBI single to left tying the game at 4-4. Moments later, it was Odom's heroics for the Chiefs as he ripped an 0-1 pitch to the center field wall scoring Titus Williams and Spillman to make it 6-4.

Senior Harper Marcotte, who came in relief in the fourth inning, pitched the final four innings allow one hit, one walk and struck out six to pick up the win.

The Chiefs will be back in action Friday at 4 p.m. against Loyola-Shreveport in the Northwood-Shreveport Tournament.
